# RELEASE OF TEVET EXAMINATION RESULTS FOR DECEMBER 2023 SERIES

The Ministry of Labour is pleased to announce the Release of Results for the December 2023 TEVET examination series as follows:

#### Level 1 Results

Out of 7168 candidates who sat for Level 1 examinations in the December 2023 Series, 4726 candidates passed representing a 66% pass rate. Out of 4708 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 3056 passed representing 65% pass rate for males. Out of 2460 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 1670 passed representing a 68% pass rate for females.

#### Level 2 Results

Out of 3601 candidates who sat for Level 2 examinations in the December 2023 series, 2436 candidates passed representing a 68% pass rate. Out of 2442 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 1588 passed representing 65% pass rate for males. Out of 1159 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 848 passed representing a 73% pass rate for females.

#### Level 3 Results

Out of 173 candidates who sat for Level 3 examinations in the December 2023 series, 88 candidates passed representing a 51% pass rate. Out of 112 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 52 passed representing 46% pass rate for males. Out of 61 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 36 passed representing 59% pass rate for females.

### Level 4 Results

Out of 73 candidates who sat for Level 4 (Diploma) examinations in the December 2023 series, 41 candidates passed representing a 56% pass rate. Out of 49 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 31 passed representing 63% pass rate for males. Out of 24 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 10 passed representing 42% pass rate for females.

Results have already been dispatched to technical colleges that administered these examinations. Candidates are requested to enquire about results through their respective colleges only.

Candidates who have not passed in these examinations are encouraged to retake the failed papers in the forthcoming July 2024 examination series. Candidates are not allowed to proceed in taking a higher level examination before passing the lower level examination.
