**RELEASE OF TEVET EXAMINATION RESULTS
FOR THE JULY 2024 SERIES**

The Ministry of Labour is pleased to announce the Release of Results for the July 2024 TEVET examination series as follows:

Level 1 Results

Out of 1156 candidates who sat for Level 1 examinations in the July 2024 Series, 666 candidates passed representing a 58% pass rate. Out of 760 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 401 passed representing 53% pass rate for males. Out of 396 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 265 passed representing a 67% pass rate for females.

Level 2 Results

Out of 629 candidates who sat for Level 2 examinations in the July 2024 series, 288 candidates passed representing a 46% pass rate. Out of 459 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 204 passed representing 44% pass rate for males. Out of 170 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 84 passed representing a 49% pass rate for females.

Level 3 Results

Out of 2083 candidates who sat for Level 3 examinations in the July 2024 series, 1326 candidates passed representing a 64% pass rate. Out of 1476 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 962 passed representing 65% pass rate for males. Out of 607 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 364 passed representing 60% pass rate for females.

Level 4 Results

Out of 15 candidates who sat for Level 4 (Diploma) examinations in the July 2024 series, 6 candidates passed representing a 40% pass rate. Out of 9 male candidates who sat for these examinations, 4 passed representing 44% pass rate for males. Out of 6 female candidates who sat for these examinations, 2 passed representing 33% pass rate for females.

Results have already been dispatched to technical colleges that administered these examinations. Candidates are requested to enquire about results through their respective colleges only. Receiving of queries regarding these results shall close on 13th December 2024. No query shall be received beyond this date.

Candidates who have not passed in these examinations are encouraged to retake the failed papers in the forthcoming July 2025 examination series. Candidates are not allowed to proceed in taking a higher level examination before passing the lower level examination.
